Patricia Prelock, Ph.D., CCC-SLP, 2013 President of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences, Professor of Communication Sciences & Disorders, and Professor of Pediatrics in the College of Medicine at the University of Vermont. Dr. Prelock coordinates innovative interdisciplinary parent training programs supporting children with neurodevelopmental disabilities and their families.

Best Practices to Support Social Communication in Children with ASD

This workshop will describe the range of evidence-based interventions most often used to support the social communication of children with ASD. It will also describe differences among interventions that are physiologically oriented, skill based, relationship based or cognitively focused. Video clips will be used to share examples of interventions including video modeling, PECS, Floor Time, pivotal response training, social stories and parent training. In addition, the critical elements for early intervention and effective educational experiences will be presented.

Advocacy, Leadership and Volunteerism: Strategies for Member Success

Natural Biomedical Interventions for Autism Spectrum Disorders

The absence of pharmaceuticals to treat autism spectrum disorders has led many families to try natural, integrative, or alternative medicines and dietary changes to help their child on the autism spectrum. Dr. Jared Skowron will review treatments used at his ASD wellness clinic. Review of neurochemistry and its relation to language and sensory delays will be discussed, along with the concurrent treatments.

2. Discuss natural, nutritional therapies that affect neurochemistry imbalance symptoms, including speech delays, sensory issues, and learning delays.
3. Review hormone imbalances in children with ASD.
4. Discuss amyloid plaque growth in neurodegenerative diseases.
5. Review treatment protocols.
