WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW?

The CHHC aims to provide an educational setting for discussion of issues related to hearing health care. Representatives David McKinley (R-WV) and Mike Thompson (D-CA) are chairing the caucus.

WHAT YOU NEED TO SAY?

- According to the National Institute of Deafness and Other Communication Disorders, approximately 15% of Americans (37.5 million) aged 18 and over report some trouble hearing; however, it is often overlooked when health care issues are considered in Congress.
- In the United States, hearing loss is among the most prevalent health problems at birth—affecting 2-3 in 1,000 births.
- An increasing number of younger people are experiencing hearing loss caused by exposure to loud noise.
- Hearing loss and tinnitus (ringing in the ears) are the number one injury that soldiers experienced in Iraq and Afghanistan.
- According to a poll commissioned by ASHA and conducted by Zogby International, more than half of high school students surveyed reported at least one symptom of hearing loss.
 - The poll looked at the usage habits of high school students and adults with respect to some popular technology that provides audio through earphones (e.g., MP3 players).
 - Sharing the survey results has increased the public's awareness of the potential for hearing loss from such devices.
